REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2006

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

ARCADEA is governed by its Constitution, adopted 2 February 1995 and last amended 20 September 2004.

ARCADEA is a registered charity. Registered Number 1046912.

The trustees, who are appointed in accordance with the requirements of the constitution, meet on a regular basis to decide overall policies and financial matters.

New trustees are elected by the existing trustees and members of the Charity. Each new trustee is provided with a copy of the Charity's Constitution and is made aware of the advice obtainable from the Charity Commission in respect of Trustees' duties and responsibilities. The Trustees meet regularly to discuss all matters of governance.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those relating to the operations and finances of the charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to the major risks.

OBJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

ARCADEA is an arts development service which is staffed and managed by disabled people. It exists to advance education in the arts, and to promote the cultural and artistic equality of disabled people.

The charity achieves its aims by:

- Working in partnership with disabled people, Disability Arts organisations, local authorities and funders to create the widest possible range of arts opportunities in the North East.
- Maintaining links with Disability Arts organisations and practitioners both locally and nationally
- Producing a newsletter, maintaining a web site and providing advice and information to arts organisations and artists working

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

2005-06 has seen a significant period of growth and consolidation for the organisation, centring on the first full year dedicated to the new strategic vision for the organisation – its repositioning, new name and identity (September 2005 saw the re-launch of NorDAF as ARCADEA) and delivery of the first year of New Directions - a two year comprehensive Professional Development Initiative for professional Disabled artists in the North East region. The organisation also completed delivery of its New Beginnings programme and maintained an organisational development strategy. Arcadea developed the staff team and 2005-06 saw the appointment of an Information Manager (PT), a new Administrator, a Networks and Projects Manager, and Training Manager (PT) and a Professional Development Manager (freelance PT). ARCADEA continued to be supported and core funded by Arts Council England through the North East Office and gained funding support from The Esmee Fairbairn Foundation, The Northern Rock Foundation, and the CSDI

Organisational Development

With the growth of the organisation and the expansion of the staff team and services provided it was necessary to equip the office with a new computer network. The new system has been very successful increasing productivity and reducing the frustrations of an outdated system. Staff and Board received organisational development training in areas of Disability Arts and Culture, Equal Opportunities, Business Development and Strategic Fundraising, Cultural Diversity and visiting a number of Disability Arts conferences.

New Beginnings

Funded through Arts Council England North East, Grants for the Arts, we delivered a programme of arts activity – theatre presentations, cabarets, a visual arts exhibition at The Discovery Museum in Newcastle Upon Tyne and a series of professional development programmes including one to one support and development planning for artists and groups, Master Classes in a range of art forms and professional development training. We employed a researcher to undertake a Networks Research project and held a number of network meetings for Disabled Artists, the first of which was hosted at The Baltic. Some of the projects conducted here acted as pilots for potentially longer term initiatives for the organisation.

New Directions

As previously stated New Directions followed on from New Beginnings and represented a two year comprehensive programme of Training and Professional Development Initiatives for Disabled Artists and Disabled Arts Professionals including One to One Support - DNA, Mentoring Programme, Training Courses, Traineeship, Master Classes and an artistic programme. We successfully re-launched NORDAF News quarterly magazine as MIMOSA MAGAZINE and immediately increased circulation by 50%. The New Directions Programme has brought many Disabled artists to the organisation who had not previously worked with us, several artists reconnected with the organisation and many others consolidated their relationship with us. We worked directly in the area of professional Development with over 120 Disabled artists from all around the North East region. This work has given direct results for many artists – but there has been significant learning for the organisation too and this has informed our planning for the next three years.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE - Continued

Research

We have conducted several pieces of research in areas previously unknown in this region – Sector Skills Analysis in partnership with the Northern Cultural Skills Partnership and The Lawnmowers, a Networks Research project encompassing Sector Skills Analysis and Professional Development Analysis. Arcadea's Director has also been researching a Cultural Model of Disability which is set to be launched in 2007 and represents an exciting development for the cultural status of Disabled People.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The financial position for the year shows a deficit of income over expenditure of £5,490 (2005- £8,704 surplus). The funds of the charity amount to £42,287 at 31st March 2006 including restricted funds of £12,657. The trustees consider the financial position to be satisfactory.

RESERVES POLICY

It is the policy of ARCADEA to maintain unrestricted reserves, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level that equates to approximately 3-6 months' running costs. This will provide sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support costs.

The financial statements, which have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005), conform to current statutory requirements and comply with the Charity's Constitution.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES IN RELATION TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS:

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity's financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year. In preparing those financial statements giving a true and fair view, the trustees should follow best practice and:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will not.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with applicable law. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

AUDITORS:

A resolution to reappoint Tait Walker as auditors for the ensuing year will be proposed at the annual general meeting.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF ARCADEA

YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2006

We have audited the financial statements of ARCADEA for the year ended 31st March 2006, which comprise the Statement of Financial Activiities, Balance Sheet and related notes which have been prepared under the historical cost convention and under the accounting policies set out on page 7 and 8.

This report is made solely to the trustees, as a body, in accordance with Section 44 of the Charities Act 1993. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the trustees those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland).

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 1993. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Trustees' report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the charity has not kept proper accounting records, or if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if a satisfactory system of internal control has not been established and maintained

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the Year Ended 31st March 2006

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

-Accounting Convention-

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

-Basis of Preparation-

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act, with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting By Charities (SORP 2005) and applicable Accounting Standards.

-Grants Receivable-

Grants of a revenue nature are credited to income in the period to which they relate.

-Fixed Assets-

Fixed assets are initially recorded at their cost.

-Depreciation-

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed asset at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset, over its expected useful life, on a straight line basis.

Fixtures and Equipment

- 15%

-Resources Expended-

All expenditure is accounted for on the accruals basis and is recognised in the SOFA when there is a legal or constructive obligation to pay for expenditure.

-Resources Policy (Resticted)-

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donor or trust deed. There are a number of restricted funds, which are restricted in accordance with the donor's wishes and incoming funds are utilised and matched against the expenditure required to meet the charitable objectives.

-Resources Policy (Unrestricted)-

Unrestricted funds comprise those funds which the trustees are free to use for any purpose in furtherance of the charitable objects. Unrestricted funds can include designated funds where the trustees, at their discretion, have created a fund for a specific purpose.

-Rent Receivable-

Rent receivable is recognised in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and is considered appropriate to be classified as generation of funds rather than investment income.

-Deferred Income-

Deferred income represents amounts received for future periods and is released to incoming resources in the period for which it has been received.

Community Chest Board Development - Capacity Building Grant to enable organisational development at a time of growth, exploring new management methodologies. The Board are to work with a consultant on this.

Arts Council England Managed Funds - This fund is to cover £15,000 towards the Director's salary.

ACE Grants For The Arts – Organisational Development - An organisational development grant to provide a new computer network for the office and also Staff and Board Training to develop the capacity of the organisation and support the organisation in a period of growth.

Arts Council England –New Beginnings- Granted in 2004-05 to be used in that financial year and into 05-06 this grant was awarded to create a year long comprehensive period of development for the organisation as it re-launched and conducted a consultation of the sector whilst delivering elements of artistic programming to maintain the profile of the organisation and pilot some potential longer term projects in areas of networking, training and professional development and artistic programming. The grant covered the costs of computer and digital equipment for the Information resource area, organisational development in the form of staff and Board training, a networks research project and elements of artistic programme.

New Directions - followed on from New Beginnings and represented a two year comprehensive programme of Training and Professional Development Initiatives for Disabled artists and Disabled Arts Professionals including One to One Support, Mentoring Programme, Training Courses, Traineeship, Master Classes and artistic programme. This was funded by the following funders:

The Northern Rock Foundation -To part fund the posts of Information Manager, Administrator, Training and Professional Development Managers and a small proportion of our programme for the year.

The Esmee Fairbairn Foundation - To provide a grant towards the cost of Training and Professional Development posts, administrator, some equipment and maintenance costs, capital expenditure on computer equipment and programme costs.

CSDI - This grant again went to cover the costs of the New Directions initiative in areas of staff salaries and programme delivery including training and professional development, and artistic programme including theatre and cabaret.
